


## Mission

## Teachers

Our highly qualified staff delivers US centered curriculum with all subjects taught in English, except Spanish and Bolivian Social Studies. ACS stresses the use of technology to enrich everyday instruction and to support the learning process at home. ## Campus

ACS facilities sets us apart from other schools in La Paz. Our beautiful campus has 22,500 Square Meters of classrooms, state of the arts theater, gardens, playgrounds, music, art, and technology labs. The ACS Calvert sports complex includes a heated pool, gym, tennis courts, lighted soccer fields, racquet-ball courts and an exercise/weight room.



## Technology

The ACS Calvert technology program teaches students, elementary through high school, to use technology responsibly. Our students learn different programs and use software to research information, write papers, understand math and science concepts, design websites, and gather data. Students learn to use the Internet in a productive and safe manner. Elementary students engage in technology weekly. Furthermore students learn to apply technology to music, art and writing.
